Information and Instructions

Auction Details:

Bids: Send bids to ATA Auctioneer **Geoff Hassall** by post to **2/30 Vale St, Birmingham Gardens, NSW 2287**, or by email to **auction@austta.org.au**. **Please note Geoff's new postal address and the new email address from October 2016.**

All values are in whole dollars. Initial bids must be received by **5pm Wednesday 31 January 2017**.

If submitting your bids by post, it is essential that you advise the Auctioneer by phone or email in case the postal delivery is delayed.

For the Lots of your choice, write your bid in the 'Minimum Bid' column. It must be not less than the amount shown in the Reserve column.

If there is the only bid for a Lot, you will pay your minimum bid price. Low bids are encouraged if you have only a modest amount to outlay, as frequently items do not sell at much higher than the reserve price.

If there are multiple bidders, but no Maximum Bids for a Lot, the Lot is sold to the highest bidder at that bid price.

You can enter a **Maximum Bid** that you are prepared to pay in the 'Maximum Bid' column.

If there is more than one bid for a Lot, all the Maximum Bids for that Lot are then considered. **The successful bidder is the person with the highest Bid (Minimum or Maximum) at a price that is the lesser of this highest Bid or 20% above the second highest Bid, unless your minimum bid is higher, in which case you pay your minimum bid.**

Your minimum bid is always assumed to be the amount you are prepared to pay regardless of competition, and is the minimum you will be charged, if successful.

If there is more than one equal bid, each bidder will be contacted by the auctioneer, preferably by email, and given the opportunity to raise their bid.

The Auctioneer will advise you, preferably by email, of the auction items where your bid was the highest, and the total value of your order. This will be done as soon as practicable after the closing date for bids, which is generally the 20th of the month in which the auction was held. In January it is later than normal due to the later despatch of the catalogue after the printer's holidays.

ATA members are given a discount of 5% when the total of successful bids is more than \$30, calculated to the nearest 5 cents.

The **cost of packing and postage** to the successful bidder **IS INCLUDED** in the **Auction bid values**. The size of the reserve price will reflect this among other things like age and scarcity.

Payment must be received within 7 days of advice that your bid has been accepted, otherwise the bid will lapse. Payment by EFT or PayPal is strongly recommended.

Auction items will be despatched to successful bidders after payment has been made.

Lots unsold after inclusion in two Auctions will be allocated to the National Timetable Collection or the Distribution List unless the vendor requests their return.

Future Auctions will be held when sufficient vendor material is available.

Codes used in the Auction Catalogue:

WTT: Working Timetable.

A4, A5, B5, DL: Item is close to these standard paper sizes.

EC: Excellent (mint) condition.

VGC: Very good condition: only minor marks, tears or creases

GC: Good condition: has some marks, tears or creases.

FC: Fair condition: has blemishes, but is still readable. PC: Poor condition: Has some pages damaged or missing.

All payments and account balances are handled by the ATA Treasurer, Len Regan.

This option is not available to vendors.
